Founded July 4, 1976, the Institute of World Culture will honor its 30th anniversary with peace visionary Frank K. Kelly delivering the Founding Day address. As the co-founder of the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation and former vice-president of the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions, Mr. Kelly draws upon a lifetime of experience in public dialogue and social activism. Mr. Kelly will share his constructive insight on the creation of a Republic of Conscience. He will address the question: how can ordinary citizens promote peace, justice and human rights to fulfill the promise of the American founders' vision and respond to the challenges of global interdependence? Mr. David Russell, director for the Oral History Project at UCSB and biographer for Frank Kelly, will introduce the speaker and his exemplary and extensive life of service, including among others his work as speechwriter to President Truman and later staff director of the Senate Majority Policy Committee.
